In the Beginning

1935 - Faith Alliance, Chilton began as a mission to Oneida Indians with Rev. Erwin Bruckner ministering.

1941 - The "Quinney Chapel" was purchased to serve the small congregation, and the church was organized. By faith, the small congregation grew.

1962 - The members took a giant step of faith and decided to move the church to the county seat, Chilton. The former St. Martin's Lutheran Church was purchased.

1973 - Rev. James Jensen answered the call to minister. The building was updated, and a parsonage was built.

1970s - Growing in strength and outreach, the congregation was led to plant a new Alliance Church in Sheboygan. The Sheboygan Alliance Church also grew and strengthened its ministry and outreach.

1980s - The Sheboygan Alliance Church stepped out in faith and planted the Plymouth Alliance Church.

❖ **PRAY, PRAY, PRAY without ceasing & with agility (press-on)**

1990s - Pastor Daniel Crom of the Sheboygan Alliance Church would often drive through Kiel and when he did, he felt a heavy burden on his heart to plant a new Alliance Church in Kiel. After prayer and consultation with District Superintendent John Fogal, and with Pastors Jim Jensen of Faith Alliance in Chilton and Pastor John Kitchen of Plymouth Alliance, the four leaders felt called by God to move forward together with a new church plant in Kiel. The three related churches would birth a new church in their geographic center. As word got out about this church plant more members joined in prayer.

❖ **LAUNCH TEAM an ever expanding group of people to build on**

A Steering Committee was formed: Joe (Chairman) & Kit Botana of Kohler, Jackie Schoenborn of Kiel, Beverly Pfiel of New Holstein and Robin & Becky Schmahl of Elkhart Lake.

❖ COLLABERATE with other believers (other churches)

May 26, 1997 - Memorial Day weekend, leaders from the C&MA District and the three churches met at the Kiel Community Center for prayer, discussion, and planning. After several hours, it was decided to move forward on a plan to establish a Bible Study in Kiel by the end of that summer.

Several families from the three churches felt called to become part of the Bible Study and eventually the new church.

August 9, 1997 - 20+ people met at the Kiel Community Center to decipher God's leading in planting a church in Kiel.

August 24, 1997 - This group, now known as, Kiel Alliance Church, met for the first time on Sunday at the Stoelting House, 309 Indian Hill (next to library) for a service at 6pm. Lucy Boll led musical worship and Robin Schmahl led the study of the Book of John. The group continued to meet regularly on Sunday evenings.

August 31, 1997 - This group hosted Doug White as their first C&MA Missionary to Brazil. The Lord led over forty folks to gather in honor of Him.

September 14, 1997 – They out grew the original building and started holding their services at the lower level of the Community Center, 311 Indian Hill (across from the library). At this time, there were 29 families on the mailing list. At this service, the group was encouraged to bring one new person with them next week.

Late September, 1997 - The ladies started a Bible study in which they studied, Be Ye Transformed (Romans 12:1-3) by Nancy Missler.

Fall, 1997 – Sing-N-Skit (Campfire for Families with school age kids) For families to get to know each other. At his time there was a plea for Children's Ministry workers. Lucy Boll at that time ran the Children's Ministry.

October, 1997 – The Steering Committee determined they need to move again due to the church growth. They reserved Kiel City Hall, 621 6th St for services.

October 12, 1997 – Pot Luck Supper took place with multiple speakers

November 15-16, 1997 – A Harvest Festival @ Robin & Becky Schmahl's Farm on County Rd FH. Hot Dog/ Marshmallow Roast along with hayrides and sing-a-longs. The message on the 16th was on "The Harvest" (evangelism)

November, 1997 - Three Pastors & District Superintendent Rev. John Fogal, have been actively engaged in the process of seeking a Pastor – Church Planter for the Kiel Alliance Church. KAC is now averaging 40-50 people a night (service).

December 12, 1997- Youth Outreach at Kiel High School Auditorium & Cafeteria, featuring a live Christian Band "In His Name", motivational speaker with a gospel message, door prizes & free pizza.

❖ **LEADERSHIP slow & steady, it takes time to build trust**

A survey was disbursed to the group to determine if they would continue to come to church at KAC, what they could financially support, & what ministry they would be interested in helping out in. This survey was to determine if they could move forward with hiring a full-time Pastor.

December 12-14, 1997 – Pastor Erick Adams from Pennsylvania, along with his wife Anne, candidated for the position of Lead Pastor.

January 30, 1998 - Pastor Erick Adams and Anne accepted the call to become the planting pastoral couple and moved to Kiel with their 3 children.

❖ **Let the VISION be known to all; all may not agree with it, but stay focused**

February 1, 1998 – Pastor Erick Adams addresses his new congregation in the Sunday night study

❖ **Find a WORSHIP LOCATION for the members to meet**

April, 1998 - (Easter Sunday, the first advertised church service) at the Kiel High School Auditorium.

That spring, the church began holding morning worship services in addition to evening studies and youth outreach activities, including youth group and Bible Quizzing.

The group felt a strong desire to reach out to the community and carried out activities like free distribution of the "Jesus Video" to the entire city and organizing large youth outreach activities. These included sponsoring packed house appearances by Christian magician Arden James "The Animated Illusionist" at the Kiel HS.

August, 1998 - They began the tradition of sponsoring and serving the Hospitality Tent at the Kiel Picnic, a tradition which continues to this day.

1998–1999 - KAC rented office space at the CRES office location on Fremont to serve as the Pastor's office and conference room for board meetings etc. It was also very convenient for storing and keeping water jugs cold for the Kiel picnic hospitality tent every summer.

1999 - KAC sent its first small contingent of youth and leaders to the LIFE Conference.

1999-2004 - Under the leadership of Robin Schmahl, KAC sponsored a youth center, called "KACY's." (Kiel Area Center for Youth - pronounced "Kasey's.") This outreach ministry met in a storefront on Fremont for local middle school and high school youth.

April 27, 2003 – There were 32 people who have affixed their signatures to the Application for Active Members.

June 5, 2003 – The Articles of Incorporation for Kiel Alliance Church were completed by James Ungrodt Attorney at Law, signed by Pastor Adams & filed with the State of Wisconsin.

❖ FINANCIAL plans to establish growth & stability with members

As the number of people attending KAC increased and the need for additional ministry space became apparent, the congregation prayerfully began the search for a permanent church facility.

Desiring to have a permanent “physical home” in the future, the church purchased several acres of land on Hwy 57 a few miles east of town with help from the district and the three other churches. The leadership also worked with an architect to develop preliminary building plans in the early 2000's. However, God had other ideas.

Trinity Lutheran Church in town decided to build a new structure in the Rockville section of town and offered the building for sale to Kiel Alliance for several hundred thousand dollars. After prayerful consideration, the church declined. Approximately a year later, the offer was made again, this time at a substantial discount. Once again, the church declined, due in part to the recent departure of the Adams' from pastoral leadership. Several months later, while still under the leadership of an interim pastor, a final opportunity to purchase the Lutheran Church building prior to it going to auction was offered. This time, the leadership felt led by God to step forward in faith to purchase the building, where they now meet and worship, at a price approximately 25% of the original offer. God is good!

November 16, 2005 – (Per Courthouse Records) Purchased the current church building located at 310 Fremont St, Kiel, WI. Took out a mortgage for \$150,000.

July 27, 2011 – (Per Courthouse Records) Purchased “The Outlet” from Jerome & Lana Wagner.

May 11, 2017 – (Per Courthouse Records) **Mortgage paid off** through mailbox money and building fund collections.

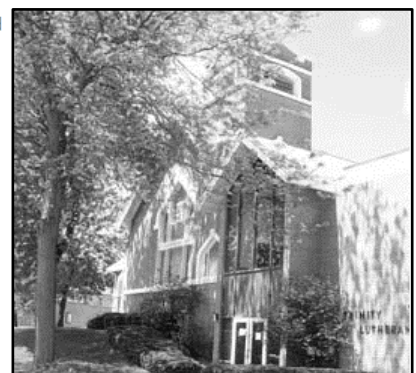

What We Believe

We believe that Christianity is much more than a statement of doctrinal beliefs. We also know that what we truly believe will greatly influence how we behave in daily life. Our fellowship as Christ-followers in the local church rests upon a clear commitment to stated biblical principles. These principles are very important to us and serve as the foundation for what we preach and teach.

Statement of Faith

There is one God,(1) who is infinitely perfect,(2) existing eternally in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.(3)

Jesus Christ is the true God and the true man.(4) He was conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary.(5) He died upon the cross, the Just for the unjust,(6) as a substitutionary sacrifice,(7) and all who believe in Him are justified on the ground of His shed blood.(8) He arose from the dead according to the Scriptures.(9) He is now at the right hand of Majesty on high as our great High Priest.(10) He will come again to establish His kingdom, righteousness and peace.(11)

The Holy Spirit is a divine person,(12) sent to indwell, guide, teach, empower the believer,(13) and convince the world of sin, of righteousness, and of judgment.(14)

The Old and New Testaments, inerrant as originally given, were verbally inspired by God and are a complete revelation of His will for the salvation of men. They constitute the divine and only rule of Christian faith and practice.(15)

Man was originally created in the image and likeness of God:(16) he fell through disobedience, incurring thereby both physical and spiritual death. All men are born with a sinful nature,(17) are separated from the life of God, and can be saved only through the atoning work of the Lord Jesus Christ.(18) The portion of the impenitent and unbelieving is existence forever in conscious torment;(19) and that of the believer, in everlasting joy and bliss.(20)

Salvation has been provided through Jesus Christ for all men; and those who repent and believe in Him are born again of the Holy Spirit, receive the gift of eternal life, and become the children of God.(21)

It is the will of God that each believer should be filled with the Holy Spirit and be sanctified wholly,(22) being separated from sin and the world and fully dedicated to the will of God, thereby receiving power for holy living and effective service.(23) This is both a crisis and a progressive experience wrought in the life of the believer subsequent to conversion.(24)

Provision is made in the redemptive work of the Lord Jesus Christ for the healing of the mortal body.(25) Prayer for the sick and anointing with oil are taught in the Scriptures and are privileges for the Church in this present age.(26)

The Church consists of all those who believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, are redeemed through His blood, and are born again of the Holy Spirit. Christ is the Head of the Body, the Church, (27) which has been commissioned by Him to go into all the world as a witness, preaching the gospel to all nations.(28) The local church is a body of believers in Christ who are joined together for the worship of God, for edification through the Word of God, for prayer, fellowship, the proclamation of the gospel, and observance of the ordinances of Baptism and the Lord's Supper.(29)

There shall be a bodily resurrection of the just and of the unjust; for the former, a resurrection unto life;(30) for the latter, a resurrection unto judgment.(31)

The second coming of the Lord Jesus Christ is imminent(32) and will be personal, visible, and premillennial.(33) This is the believer's blessed hope and is a vital truth which is an incentive to holy living and faithful service.(34)

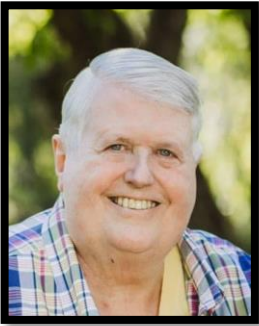

Discovery Land (DL) is a Christian education program designed for use by local churches to help children "Discover Eternal Treasures" in God's Word. It is a FUN, ENGAGING, and EFFECTIVE way to inspire kids to know and love God. It specializes in using hands-on learning activities that challenge students to talk about and apply what they learn. It is strategic and purposeful and considers the spiritual development of children.

2. THE GOSPEL OF JESUS: Salvation by grace through faith as presented throughout the entire Bible.

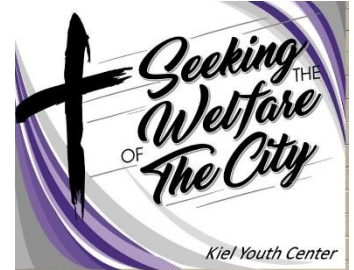
Kiel Youth Center (aka The Outlet)

 - A weekday program of Christian education for children featuring religious study courses, arts and crafts, and recreation conducted by local Christian churches for a week during summer vacation.
